Jeffery Schwehm was raised as a Jehovah's Witness from the age of five. He began going door-to-door as a Jehovah's Witness at the age of six, and gave his first sermon at the Kingdom Hall at the age of eight. By the time he was seventeen years old he had become a full-time pioneer minister for the Jehovah's Witnesses, which meant he spent 1000 hours a year as a door-to-door evangelist. He also served at the World Headquarters of Jehovah's Witnesses in Brooklyn, New York, which is where he met his wife, Kathy. In 1996, Jeffery and Kathy left the Jehovah's Witnesses, and in 2003, God led them home to His Holy Catholic Church. Those of you who watch EWTN may have seen Jeffery last winter when he was a guest on the "Journey Home" program, hosted by Marcus Grodi and seen live at 7:00 p.m. on Monday evenings.

In 2005, Jeffery and Kathy started "THE FELLOWSHIP OF CATHOLIC EX-JEHOVAH'S WITNESSES," an apostolate that assists Jehovah's Witnesses back home to the Catholic Church, and helps Catholics learn how to more effectively share the fullness of the Christian faith with their Jehovah Witness friends and relatives. 
CHECK OUT "newadvent.org" FOR RESEARCH REGARDING CHURCH FATHERS, AND MUCH MORE...
